## WHY A CHARTER

## A Charter serves as a framework for our government

- It is a local constitution for town government
- Created with high degree of community input
- Upholds Connecticut and New England Traditions
- Specific to needs and interests of Chester
- Permits a flexible and innovative approach
- State statutes set parameters which can be restrictive for Town government
- Arbitrary population threshold
- Limits opportunities

## AUDIENCE OF CITIZENS - DRAFT CHARTER ISSUES RAISED

## The following issues will be addressed in remarks provided by the Commission:

- Increase in number of members of the Board of Selectmen
- Assumption of fiscal responsibilities by Board of Selectmen, professional staff, and Fiscal Policy Committee
- Appointment vs. election for some of the agencies with regulatory authority
- Elimination of alternates from agencies
- For an agency with 7 members - reduction in maximum number members from the political party holding a majority on the agency from 5 to 4 members
- Request to require use of Robert's Rules of Order for all agency meetings
- Consider BOS Audit Committee
- Consider an Ethics Commission

- Increases number of members
- Provides opportunity for wider range of expertise for assuming expanded responsibilities

## CONTINUITY AND COMPLEXITY

- Professional manager is a qualification and performance-based position with education, skills and experience for successfully administering quality service to the public effectively and efficiently
- Enables Board of Selectmen to focus on policy development, strategic planning, \& overseeing \& monitoring performance of the professional manager

CONTINUITY, COMPLEXITY, AND ENGAGEMENT

- Revised framework for financial management and budget process
- Responsibility and accountability for budget development and performance assumed by Board of Selectmen with support from Town Administrator, Finance Director, and Fiscal Policy Committee
- Aligns the Town's fiscal authorities with the authority and responsibility for policies, programs, services, and initiatives - and their funding

## COMPLEXITY AND ENGAGEMENT

- Addresses typically low attendance at Town Meetings
- Provides for informed decisions by expanded Board of Selectmen
- Preserves Town Meetings for major actions including adoption of the Annual Town Budget
- Simplifies approval process for many routine actions
- Creates opportunity for Voters to "petition" for Town Meeting on some BOS actions

## CONTINUITY, COMPLEXITY

- Tax Collector \& Town Clerk are administrative positions more suited for appointment of qualified individuals rather than by election. Ongoing training and certification are required
- Appointment provides for continuity where there are complex duties \& responsibilities
- Appointed combined position of Finance Director/Treasurer provides unified approach for financial management with BOS oversight

- Board of Finance responsibilities provided by revised Fiscal Authorities - Town

## CONTINUITY, COMPLEXITY, AND ENGAGEMENT

- Term changes to 4 years for engaging Elector interest in serving, continuity, as well as addressing complexity
- Region 4 BOE terms set at 6 years by Special Act and regional consistency with Deep River and Essex

## CONTINUITY, COMPLEXITY, AND ENGAGEMENT

- Addresses engagement and challenges in finding Electors to serve
- Eliminating Alternates intended to reinforce engagement, involvement and commitment of members elected or appointed


## AGENCIES: POLITICAL PARTY REPRESENTATION

## ENGAGEMENT

- Encourages bipartisan decision-making and engages those other than majority party members
- For appointive agencies establishes principle of expanding pool of candidates to include unaffiliated Electors as well as minority party members

## Process - Next Steps

- Review / Revise PROPOSED Draft Charter
- Deliver DRAFT Charter to BOS through Town Clerk
- BOS holds Public Hearing(s)
- Charter Commission considers BOS recommendations for changes, if any
- If recommendations provided - Charter Commission provides response (with or without changes) - followed by BOS vote on whether to send FINAL Charter to Town Referendum for adoption vote.
- If no recommendations - BOS votes on whether to send FINAL Charter to Town Referendum for adoption vote

NOTE: Consideration of Charter has been a deliberative two-year process with BOS decision to create Governance Study Committee through completion of work by the Charter Commission and finally a town-wide referendum to consider adoption.
